

DATA NOTICE & CORRECTION / REMOVAL REQUESTS

Last updated: 20.07.2026

This Data Notice (“**Notice**”) explains how **node101** (“**node101**”, “**we**”, “**us**” or “**our**”) collects, uses, generates, publishes and otherwise processes limited information relating to developers whose publicly accessible software-development presence is included on

<https://blockchaindeveloper.report>.

This Notice also explains how developers may request access to, correction of or removal of their profiles.

2. Scope of This Notice

This Notice applies to limited information relating to developers obtained from publicly accessible software-development profiles, repositories and related online activity.

It does not govern personal data collected directly from visitors when they browse our website, contact us or use our other services. Such processing is described in our separate documents, where applicable.

3. Data We Process

We limit the Data processed and publicly displayed on the website to the following:

Data category	Description
Public username/nickname	The username or account identifier publicly associated with the relevant software-development profile.

Source profile link	A link directing website visitors to the relevant publicly accessible developer profile.
Programming-language information	Programming languages identified from publicly accessible repositories, code and related software-development activity associated with the relevant account.
Technical and request records	Limited information required to process correction, objection or removal requests, verify control of the relevant account, maintain a suppression record and protect the security of the website.

We do not intend to collect or display developers' location, email address, biography, telephone number or other unnecessary contact or profile information.

We do not intentionally infer or display information concerning a developer's nationality, age, gender, health, political opinions, religious beliefs, ethnicity or other sensitive personal characteristics.

4. Sources of Data

Data is obtained indirectly from:

- publicly accessible software-development profiles;
 - publicly accessible software repositories and code;
 - publicly accessible activity associated with the relevant developer account;
- and

Data is collected only from sources that are accessible to the public without access to private accounts, private repositories or restricted content.

5. How Programming-Language Information Is Generated

Programming-language information is generated by analysing publicly accessible repositories, code and related software-development activity associated with a public developer account.

The information is intended to provide a limited factual indication of the programming languages appearing in the account's publicly accessible activity. It is not intended to constitute:

- a comprehensive evaluation of the developer's professional experience;
- a ranking or performance score;
- an assessment of competence, reliability or employability; or
- a recommendation concerning recruitment, engagement or any other significant decision.

node101 does not use this information to make decisions producing legal or similarly significant effects concerning developers.

6. Purposes of Processing

We process Data for the following purposes:

1. creating and maintaining a searchable directory of publicly accessible developer activity data;
2. displaying links to the relevant public source profiles;
3. identifying and displaying programming languages and SDKs appearing in publicly accessible software-development activity;
4. keeping professional developing information reasonably current and accurate;
5. responding to access, correction, objection and removal requests;
6. preventing removed profiles from being automatically recreated;
7. protecting the operation, integrity and security of the website;
8. establishing, exercising or defending legal claims; and
9. complying with applicable legal and regulatory obligations.

Data will not be used for purposes incompatible with those described in this Notice without an appropriate legal basis and, where required, further notice.

7. Legal Grounds for Processing

Under Law No. 6698 on the Protection of Personal Data (“**KVKK**”), we process:

- publicly disclosed usernames and source profile links, to the extent that the processing is consistent with the nature and purpose of their public disclosure; and
- programming-language information and related technical records where processing is necessary for the legitimate interests pursued by node101, provided that such processing does not prejudice the fundamental rights and freedoms of the relevant developer.

Where applicable, Data may also be processed where necessary for compliance with a legal obligation or for the establishment, exercise or protection of a legal right.

Where the General Data Protection Regulation (“**GDPR**”) applies, we rely primarily on our legitimate interests in operating a limited factual indexing and analytics service concerning publicly accessible software-development activity.

In assessing those interests, we take into account:

- the public nature of the source information;
- the limited categories of data processed;
- the exclusion of contact, location and sensitive information;
- the factual and non-determinative nature of the programming-language information;
- the availability of correction, objection and removal mechanisms; and
- the rights and reasonable expectations of developers.

Where the California Consumer Privacy Act, as amended (“**CCPA**”), applies, we process Data for the business and commercial purposes described in this Notice.

Information that a developer has lawfully made available to the general public may be treated as publicly available information under California law.

Programming-language information generated by node101 may nevertheless be treated as personal information where it is linked or reasonably linkable to an identifiable developer.

8. Public Display and Recipients

The following Data is made publicly available through the website:

- public username;
- source profile link; and
- Certain programming-language commit frequency information.

This information may therefore be viewed by any person who accesses the relevant website page.

Data may also be disclosed, where necessary and proportionate, to:

- hosting, cloud infrastructure and database providers;
- software development, maintenance and cybersecurity providers;
- analytics and operational service providers;
- professional advisers, including lawyers and auditors;
- public authorities, courts and regulatory bodies where legally required; and
- parties involved in a merger, investment, restructuring, acquisition or transfer of node101 or its relevant assets.

Service providers processing Data on our behalf are required to process it only for authorised purposes and subject to appropriate contractual, technical and organisational safeguards.

9. International Transfers

Certain service providers, hosting facilities or technical systems may be located outside local servers or may permit access to Data from another country.

Where Data is transferred internationally, node101 will use the transfer mechanism and safeguards required under applicable law, which may include:

- an adequacy decision;
- a standard contract or contractual clauses approved by the competent authority;
- binding corporate rules;
- another legally recognised appropriate safeguard; or
- a limited statutory exception where its conditions are satisfied.

Information concerning the applicable transfer mechanism may be requested using the contact details in Section 13.

10. Retention, Updating and Removal

Data is retained only for as long as reasonably necessary for the purposes described in this Notice.

We periodically review and refresh information using publicly accessible software-development activity.

A profile may be removed or suppressed where:

- the relevant source profile has been deleted or made private;
- the information is materially inaccurate or no longer relevant;
- a valid correction, objection or removal request is accepted;
- continued processing is no longer necessary; or
- retention is no longer legally permitted.

Where a profile is removed, we may retain a minimal internal suppression identifier so that the profile is not automatically recreated during a later data refresh. The suppression record will not be publicly displayed. Records relating to privacy requests, verification and legal compliance will be retained for 10 (ten) years or for any longer period required for compliance with legal obligations or the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

11. Correction and Removal Requests

A person may request:

- access to the Data associated with their public developer account;
- correction of inaccurate information;
- updating of the programming-language information;
- objection to the continued processing or publication of the profile; or
- removal and suppression of the profile.

To protect developers and prevent unauthorized requests, we may ask the requester to provide reasonable evidence that they control the relevant public developer account.

Verification may be completed through:

- authentication through the relevant source platform;
- a temporary confirmation added to the relevant public profile or repository;
- communication through an address publicly associated with the relevant account; or
- another reasonable and proportionate verification method.

We will not request more information than is reasonably necessary to verify and process the request.

Submission of a removal request does not guarantee deletion in every circumstance. We may retain limited information where required by law or where necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims. Where we refuse a request, we will explain the applicable reason to the extent required by law.

12. Your Privacy Rights

Under Article 11 of the KVKK, relevant persons may request information concerning:

- whether their personal data is processed;
- information about the processing if their personal data has been processed;
- the purpose of processing and whether the data is used in accordance with that purpose;
- third parties to whom personal data has been transferred in Türkiye or abroad;
- correction of incomplete or inaccurate personal data;
- deletion or destruction of personal data where the applicable legal conditions are satisfied;
- notification of correction, deletion or destruction to third parties to whom the data has been transferred;
- objection to a result arising against them through the analysis of personal data exclusively by automated systems; and
- compensation where they suffer damage due to unlawful processing.

Applications under the KVKK must be submitted using a legally recognised application method and must contain sufficient information to identify the applicant and the request.

Where the GDPR applies, a developer may have the right to:

- access their personal data;

- correct inaccurate or incomplete personal data;
- request deletion;
- request restriction of processing;
- object to processing based on legitimate interests;
- receive certain personal data in a portable format where the legal conditions apply; and
- lodge a complaint with the competent data protection authority.

Where processing is based on legitimate interests, a developer may object on grounds relating to their particular situation. We will cease the relevant processing unless we demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds that override the developer's interests, rights and freedoms, or the processing is required for legal claims.

If the CCPA applies to node101 and to the relevant processing, California residents may have the right to:

- know the categories and specific pieces of personal information collected;
- know the sources, purposes and categories of recipients;
- request correction of inaccurate personal information;
- request deletion, subject to statutory exceptions;
- opt out of the sale or sharing of personal information, where applicable; and
- exercise their privacy rights without unlawful discrimination.

Node101 does not sell or share Data as those terms are defined under the CCPA.

An authorised agent may submit a request on behalf of a California resident, subject to the verification and authorisation requirements permitted under California law.

13. Contact and Complaints

Questions, concerns and requests relating to this Notice or Data may be submitted through the communication point revealed above.

Where applicable, you may also submit a complaint to the competent data protection authority, including:

- the Turkish Personal Data Protection Authority;
- the competent supervisory authority in the European Economic Area; or
- the California Privacy Protection Agency or California Attorney General.

14. Changes to This Notice

We may update this Notice where the processing activities, website functionality or applicable legal requirements change.
